

BBA vs. Major and Minor Programs in Economics for Management Studies

The University of Toronto Scarborough's Academic Calendar states that students in the Bachelor of Business Administration Program (B.B.A) may **NOT** jointly enroll in either a Minor or Major Program in Economics for Management Studies.

In all Specialist Programs leading to a B.B.A. students are required to take ECMA04H, ECMA06H, ECMB02H, ECMB06H, ECMB11H, ECMB12H, and one FCE at the C-level. Since the course requirements for the Minor Program are entirely contained within the B.B.A. Program, it **CANNOT** be granted in addition to the B.B.A. In the same sense, since the course requirements for the Major Program greatly overlap with those of the B.B.A. Program it too **CANNOT** be granted in addition to the B.B.A.

Under "Regulations Concerning Program of Study" in the 2008-09 Academic Calendar (pg. 19) it states:

"Where a student completes the requirements of a Minor Program and subsequently chooses to complete a Major or Specialist Program in the same area the student may use the courses already accredited to the Minor Program to fulfill the requirements of the Major or Specialist Program. Upon successful completion of the additional requirements, any previous certification of the Minor Program will be superseded on the student's transcript by certification of the Major or Specialist Program."
