

# Career Learning Network (CLN) and Co-op

The CLN is a career-focused portal that brings together students and recent graduates with internal and external university partners. Co-op students may use it as an additional resource for identifying work term opportunities. In CLN, Co-op students can:

- Find postings for **on and off-campus jobs** and **research opportunities**
- Sign up for **experiential opportunities** with employers, alumni and partners
- Register for career fairs and employer info sessions on all three campuses
- Access quality career and employment **resources**

## Jobs Board

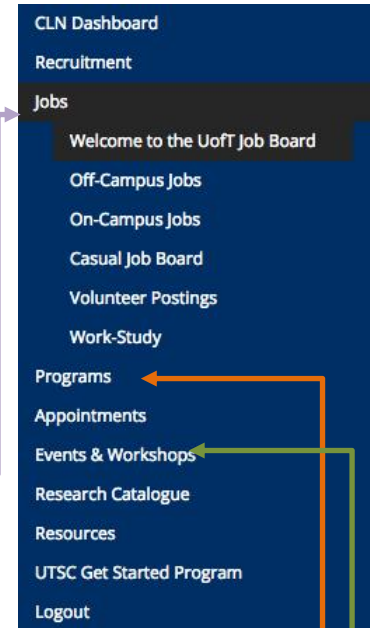
The Jobs board is your link to hundreds of opportunities both on and off campus. Co-op students might find:

- Off-Campus Jobs (Full-time Immediate and Summer categories)
- On-Campus Jobs (also Full-time and Summer categories)

These positions may be suitable for Co-op – copy/paste/send interesting postings to your Student Development Coordinator to find out if they qualify!

### How to search:

1. Select the type of opportunity you are seeking (e.g. Off-Campus Jobs).
2. Review all advertised positions or use Advanced Search to filter your search criteria. A suggestion for filtering: if a filter does not matter to you, do not select it, in order to see more postings!



## Programs

Use Programs to begin developing relationships with potential Co-op employers early!

- **Extern Job Shadowing:** Job shadow professionals in their workplace to explore your career options and clarify your career goals
- **In the Field:** Tour professional organizations and companies to learn if they are a fit for you
- **Partners in Leadership:** Be mentored by UTSC alumni to ease your transition from school to work

## Events & Workshops

Meeting directly with potential employers and working professionals is a great way to gain a competitive edge for a co-op position, to learn more about an industry and a company's culture. These sessions allow you to practice your networking skills while gaining valuable hiring process insight from alumni and recruiters.

Space is limited and these sessions fill up quickly. Be sure to sign up in advance, and attend, in order to make the best impression.

Employer Info Sessions, Career and Job Fairs, and other work-relevant events and workshops are posted in the Events & Workshops area in CLN.
