The Pande-Mic Project (Provisional title only)

Our annual production will be a devised piece of multimedia theatre that tackles an inescapable topic of our times. As the COVID-19 pandemic has radically reshaped our ways of being in the world and in community, it has also summoned us to reimagine the making of theatre. The piece takes up this challenge while aiming to provide a space where students can creatively process how this societal reshaping has impacted them, both individually and collectively.

Drawing from the participants' personal (yet anonymous) stories, interviews with their peers, popular culture and literature, we will weave a tapestry of voices and intersectional perspectives that connect the intimate to the public, the personal to the political.

A few overlapping questions will guide the development of the show: In what ways has the pandemic affected this diverse community of students? Since youth are less vulnerable (but not immune) to this "plague," what other societal "plagues" may function as pre-existing conditions that potentially make this sanitary crisis more virulent to them than it appears? And finally: Is there a "silver lining"? Could the stories young people share now have a contagious effect and help shape their future?

THR B/C/D 56 Application

This course is an intensive study of theatrical production from the vantage points of producers, directors (and assistant directors), designers (and assistant designers), stage managers (and assistant stage managers), and dramaturgs. It engages students in the experiential learning process inherent in conceiving of, planning for, rehearsing, and producing a major theatrical production.

Permission of the Theatre and Performance Studies instructor (includes an interview)

Note:

- 1. This course will meet at non-traditional times when the show rehearsals and production meetings are scheduled.
- 2. **TIME COMMITMENT:** Keep in mind that this is an **intensive course** that will require you to meet, develop, and work outside of regular class times including evenings and weekends. At this point our performances are scheduled for March 11 through 13, and 18 through 20, Preceding this will be tech week which is likely to be during March 5 through 10.
- THRB56H3 is intended for Year 1 and 2 students at UTSC, or advanced students who are new to producing, directing, designing, stage management, and dramaturgy. More advanced producers, directors, designers, stage managers, and dramaturgs are encouraged to register for THRC56H3 or THRD56H3.
- 4. THRC56H3 is intended for Year 3 students at UTSC with some theatrical experience. Beginning students are encouraged to register for THRB56H3, while more advanced producers, directors, designers, stage managers, and dramaturgs are encouraged to register for THRD56H3.
- 5. THRD56H3 is intended for Year 4 students at UTSC with extensive theatrical experience. Less experienced producers, directors, designers, stage managers, and dramaturgs are encouraged to register for THRB56H3 or THRC56H3.
