Calculator Policy: Only APPROVED calculators may be used.
The APPROVED calculators are: Texas Instruments (TI-30, TI-34II Explorer Plus, TI-Explorer Plus, TI-531, EL-509), Casio (fx-65, fx-250, fx-260, fx-280).

Invigilators have the authority to check calculators and confiscate any not appearing on the above list. Should this happen an immediate penalty of 10% will be imposed on this test.

No cell phones are allowed on the students or at their desks during the test/exam. A cell phone is considered as an unauthorized aid since it can store text information and images and is therefore covered under the unauthorized aid in Code B.I.1 (b) (p. 386 of the 2006/07 Calendar).

ABSENCES - Term Tests and Exams

THERE IS NO MAKE-UP FOR THE TERM TEST. Provided that your medical note clearly outlines the reason for your absence then the 25% for the term test will be added to the final exam and the final exam will then be worth 65% of your final mark. Please note that on page 373 of the 2006/2007 UTSC Calendar it states:

"You cannot petition to withdraw from a course on grounds that no work was returned to

you before the last day to withdraw without academic penalty if this is the result of your having been given an extension to complete your work for reasons relating to you and not the rest of your class."


Should you have to miss the term test then you should notify the CHMA11H Instructor, Ann Verner at 287-7224 or email verner@utsc.utoronto.ca as soon as possible and have the UTSC medical from completed by your doctor. Click on the link below to download a suitable blank medical form that can be printed and filled out by the doctor at the time of your appointment.

Medical note form to be completed by the doctor.

The medical note should:

- -verify that the student was examined on the day of the test
- if possible, state the illness and
- it MUST indicate the physician's professional opinion as to whether the student should receive special consideration on medical grounds.

If you miss the Final Exam, you must petition the Registrar's Office to write a make-up exam in the next formal exam period. e.g. for a missed April Final Exam, the make-up Exam is in August. Your documentation is crucial for a successful petition and must be submitted by the last day of the exam period. Check the UTSC Calendar for instructions and deadlines!
