* Notations on Course Load Changes

- In order to be eligible for Full Time (FT) OSAP you must be a full-time student.
 - To be considered full time you must be registered in a minimum course load of 60% or 1.5 credits in each semester. No averaging over semesters is allowed!
 - Students with a permanent or prolonged or persistent disability must registered in a minimum course load of 40% or 1.0 credit in each semester. **No averaging over semesters is allowed!**
- If your course load change results in dropping to part-time status, you are <u>no longer</u> eligible for FT OSAP funding as of your withdrawal date. In addition, you will be placed on OSAP Academic Probation OR Restriction and this change may result in one or more of the following:
 - Reassessment of your OSAP funding
 - this reassessment may result in a grant and/or loan overpayment
 - Voluntary repayment
 - Grant to Loan conversion
 - o Loss of eligibility for future funding from OSAP
 - Notification to the National Student Loans Service Centre of the change to your study period end date which will affect the Interest Free status of your loans

OSAP Obligations: As an OSAP recipient you are required to report any changes to: personal information, study period and program information, enrolment status, including course load changes. You must ensure <u>all</u> the information on your application is accurate and up-to-date.

Declaration: I am providing complete and accurate information to update my OSAP application. I understand I must promptly notify the Financial Aid Office, in writing, of any future changes. I understand that income information for me and my parent(s) (or spouse) will be verified with the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). Verification of income, when it occurs, may result in a reassessment of my funding for the academic year and should an overpayment in loan and/or grant funding result, this overpayment may affect my future OSAP eligibility. Failure to verify the income on my application will result in grant funding being converted to a loan.
