## Update to Community Alert sent on July 13, 2023. Updated suspect description included below.

Toronto Police Service (TPS) continues to investigate a reported sexual assault that occurred near 130 Old Kingston Road (located in the Valley Land Trail) last week. It is reported that a female pedestrian was approached by an unknown male and subsequently assaulted. The reported assault took place in the afternoon. UTSC Campus Special Constables are conducting proactive patrols of the area. Below is an updated description of the suspect.

## Updated description of suspect.

The suspect is described as male, white, 20 to 30 years old, approximately 6'4, with facial stubble and light brown to dirty blonde short hair. The suspect was wearing a black t-shirt, khaki cargo pants (possibly capri length) and sandals.
